Items Covered by ATA Carnet

Commercial samples: e.g. jewellery, apparel, watches, leather goods.

Items for display or use at international exhibitions, trade shows or similar events, e.g. various types of products, equipment, antiques, paintings and other works of art, display booths or stands.

Professional equipment, which includes: press, sound and television broadcasting equipment, cinematographic equipment, musical instruments, costumes, theatrical effects and sets, equipment for seminars, meetings, demonstration, testing, maintaining or repairing machinery, equipment for use by surgeons, zoologistes, entrainer, lectures, sportsmen etc.

Items not Covered by ATA Carnet

Consumable/disposable items.

Items intended to be given away.

Items already sold or offered for sale.

Uncounted gems or gemstones, theatrical make-up, etc.

Alcoholic beverages, Tobacco, fuels, etc.

Goods intended for processing or repair.



ATA Carnet is an international Customs Document issued by an authorized Chamber of commerce on which goods can be moved through a number of countries who are the members of the ATA international Guarantee Chain without raising bonds or paying Customs Duty and Taxes or completing the normal Customs Procedures. This facility can be used for temporarily importing goods into the country or temporarily exporting goods.

For Import ...

The importer needs to obtain the ATA carnet from the Guaranteeing Association in the country of shipment.

For Export ...

ATA carnet is issued by Dubai Chamber of Commerce and Industry



- Currently UAE accepts carnet for exhibition goods only
- Clearance is available only in the customs counter
- Clearance is done on ATA document
- No fees are collected nor do customs ask for any other document other than ATA
- In case the holder fails to export goods under ATA Carnet, customs will invoke its right to claim the applicable duty charges from the Guaranteeing Association
